



Sports Racing Car Enthusiasts!

Attached are the regs and entry form for the first NSCC event of 2018; 17 March at Zwartkops (a copy of which will shortly also be available at www.nscsa.co.za)

Please note that paid-up entries received by the organisers prior to 1 March will receive the 'early-bird' rate of R1,450 which represents a R100 discount on the 'full' entry fee.

It may be that NSCC cars will also be eligible to enter the SRA sprint races but we will clarify that possibility closer to the time.

Please get your entries in as soon as possible as timing of entry tends to impact the allocation of pit space over the busier race weekends and this, being an Extreme Festival event, is likely to be well supported by competitors and the public alike.

I would be grateful that when submitting your entry forms to the organisers (events@zwartkops.co.za) you also make copy to info@nscsa.co.za so that we can help ensure with the organisers that no entries fall through the cracks. In the meantime, it would also assist if you could mail a preliminary 'intention to enter' to info@nscsa.co.za so that we know which trees we still need to shake in order to build up a good field of entries.

Those of you who have submitted race number requests as part of your racing membership applications to NSCC can go ahead and enter using the race number requested. Otherwise, we will collate from your entry forms which race numbers you prefer to use but may need one or other to amend their preferred number to eliminate duplicates.

Remember, to enter an NSCC event you need to be a racing member of the NSCC and that the offer of a discounted racing membership fee of R200 expires on 15 February whereafter the standard fee of R250 will apply. Membership application and payment information appears in the 'Downloads' section at www.nscsa.co.za.

While only a 'Club' license from MSA is required to enter the NSCC events, those of us who have inadvertently become 'Masters' as a consequence of having celebrated a 50th birthday (our own, not our girlfriend's) will, as part of the licence application process, need to submit an 'Effort ECG' to MSA. I understand that if you submitted that documentation as part of a 2017 license application, a new 'Effort ECG' report will be required only in 2019 but this is only my understanding and not necessarily gospel. As in all such things, try and complete your license application process as soon as possible to avoid last minute disappointment / frustration.

This gives all of you with cars eligible for the series five full weeks to chase out the spiders from the airbox, to pump up the tyres, and to give that magnificent sports racing thoroughbred a good polish so that we can get the newly restructured NSCC race series off to a good start.
